#### **New Releases**

Apple Computer this week began asking its developers to test and report back to the company on the first external pre-release build of Mac OS X 10.4.3, a forthcoming maintenance release to the Mac OS X 10.4 Tiger operating system.

Like the previously released Mac OS X 10.4.2 Update, tipsters say that Mac OS X 10.4.3 continues to focus on improving the overall reliability and stability of the Tiger OS. 10.4.3 is targeted for release in September.

M\$\$'s next OS, Vista, formerly known as Longhorn, is trying this pre-release method, which they have not tried before. Interestingly, they are incorporating a permission-based approach. So, not only will the look and feel be familiar (read copied), but the step-up in security will be similar also. UNIX is both time-tested and ever new.

### eMail Study

The study of 3,000 email users by peripherals firm i.Tech Dynamic has revealed the top five email gripes as:

\* Overusing capitals

\* Too many abbreviations

\* Blank subject box

\* Being copied on every email

\* People being 'over friendly'.

"Email is such a massive part of our lives nowadays, and we do get set in our ways when it comes to things like fonts and the etiquette of writing at work," said a spokesman for i.Tech, which conducted the research as part of its development of a Bluetooth keyboard.

"People should be aware that some fonts are too elaborate for professional documents, not to mention hard to read. If you stick to the basic fonts and in a reasonable size and color, you should be pretty safe and not offend anyone."

An addition should be wallpaper with colored text that blends with the background.

Another bug-a-boo is eMail that tries to make you believe that you will die if you do not send this to every relative, friend and neighbor within 30 seconds of receiving it. This is a form of virus and nothing less.

#### **iBooks**

Xlr8yourmac has published some video benchmarks of the recently release iBooks. The new iBooks offer the Radeon 9550 graphics card that provides additional performance as well as support for Core Image and Core Video.

In a comparison between a 1.2GHz iBook / Radeon 9200 (old) and a 1.2GHz iBook / Radeon 9550 (new), the Radeon 9550 iBook delivered an 11% frame rate advantage in Quake 3 with sound on and a 22.9% advantage with sound off.

The actual shipping iBooks come in 12" 1.33GHz and 14" 1.42GHz models.
